Due diligence

COWI performs a screening to uncover human rights risks before entering into a project. The process helps identify possible violations of human rights on a specific project.

COWI Whistleblower

All of COWI's employees and other stakeholders have an opportunity to report violations of law, including violations related to modern slavery and human trafficking, through the COWI whistleblower.

All new employees are introduced to these procedures as part of COWI's onboarding programme, and the procedures are included in our project management training.

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the UK's Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes the COWI Group's slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ended 31 December 2017.
